Corporation Model of Excellence

What is the Sunman-Dearborn Community Schools "Model of Excellence"? Why was it created? Who was involved? What does it represent? These are all very good questions to begin the discussion on this topic. The corporation model is a picture that represents the programs, qualities, beliefs and values of Sunman-Dearborn Community Schools. The model was created to provide our schools with a template or a filter to use when we examine our programs and practices that we use to help our students.

It unifies our schools in the district. Most importantly, it sets forth a clear understanding of our purpose as a school corporation. The model focuses on the belief statement that: "All students achieve their highest level of personal and academic success." It is our duty as educators to be diligent in our efforts to help our students reach those levels of success.

The development of the model took place over several months of the 2009-2010 school year. Each teacher was given the opportunity to respond to a set of questions that were used to describe the school corporation in terms of programs, practices, values and beliefs. A committee of teachers and administrators was formed to review the comments from the staff members. From those comments, the committee identified common themes and ideas. Those common themes were then placed into a picture. The Greek-style building was selected to represent our school system.

The foundation of the building represents our devoted and dedicated stakeholders. Without the support of our students, parents, teachers, administrators, school board members, and community, our schools and our school district would not be where they are today. The strong-focused leadership from our students, parents, teachers, administrators, board members and community has created a clear direction for our school district. This direction supports our excellent facilities, quality programs, and highly qualified teachers and administrators. The columns represent the key supports of

our district. Quality curriculum, best practices in instruction, and informed assessments allow our teachers to provide the necessary strategies to encourage student learning through engaging practices. The emphasis on providing our teachers with information and training through professional development opportunities ensures that our district will continue to move in the right direction. With our focus on being effective communicators, our district is continuing to find ways to inform our community about our programs and the issues that impact our schools. 
The crown or roof of the model provides protection for our schools. It focuses on the need to have a positive and safe learning environment for our students and teachers.

PROTECTING OUR STUDENTS

Sunman-Dearborn Community Schools has just revised the Criminal History Information policy. To help ensure a safe environment for our students, and as required by state law (I.C. 20-26-5-10), we have required all employees hired after 7/1/2009 to obtain an Expanded Criminal History Background check. Volunteers who have direct or unsupervised contact with children will also be required to obtain an Expanded Criminal History Background check. Volunteers who are directly

supervised by a Sunman-Dearborn employee will have a Limited Background check (no charge, and can be done at each school). These background checks are good for five (5) years.

If you wish to volunteer and have questions regarding your background check or how to complete a background check, please contact the front office at your child's school.

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
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To Create a Culture of Educational Excellence for Each Student!
