SDIS DESTINATION IMAGINATION ROCKS!!



Destination Imagination is a very active organization in the Sunman-Dearborn Community Schools. If you are not sure what it is all about, the following is some insight on the focus of the club. It involves "creative" problem-solving at many levels.



Destination Imagination is a group of kids who solve problems creatively and then make a play around it. At the Intermediate School level, there are 6 different challenges to choose from: improvise, technical, scientific, fine arts, structural, and Project OUTREACH. The themes of the challenges change every year. As a team, you cannot receive help from adults in the building (unless it's dangerous), including brainstorming ideas. The adults are responsible for buying the materials that are needed to build props and supervise meetings.

For the past months, the D.I. team at S-DIS has:

- 1) Picked the challenge: Project OUTREACH
- 2) Walked door to door to businesses searching for ideas
- 3) Found our community project
- 4) Mapped a section of Greendale Cemetery

And now they are working to finish the project. Project OUTREACH is the challenge to find and carry out plans to help a need in our community. The definition for community is a group of people with at least one common need, for example, your neighbors or families in China.

The project is mapping cemeteries. Mapping cemeteries was by far the most creative, so that's why it was picked. Mapping the cemetery in Greendale will be helpful to the people who love genealogy. They can look at their ancestors' tombstones to gather information for their research. Also, GIS Services, a local geographical mapping company located in the Dearborn County Administration Building, collects data just like the information the team collected. It took the DI team about a day to map approximately five hundred graves. It was hard work, but they got it done. Now they need to finish small parts of the project, and finish the play portion of the challenge.

ISTEP+ at our Elementary Schools

This spring, the third and fourth grade students of our three elementary schools will take the Indiana Statewide Testing for Educational Progress Plus, also known as ISTEP+. This statewide, standardized test, which is required by law, will be given in two parts. The first part is called the Applied Skills Test, and it will take place the first week of March. The second component of the test will take place the last week in April. For our fourth graders, this portion will be taken online in our computer labs. Both portions of the test will cover English/Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies.

The purpose of the Indiana Statewide Testing for Educational Progress Plus (ISTEP+) program is to measure student achievement in the subject areas of English/Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies. In particular, ISTEP+ reports student achievement levels according to the Indiana Academic Standards that were adopted in November 2000 by the Indiana State Board of Education. An Applied Skills Assessment and a Multiple-Choice Assessment are used to measure these standards; they are required components of the ISTEP+ program.

Program Facts

- 320 seventh through twelfth grade band students in six different band classes.
- Program includes an educationally sound diverse approach to musical styles including; Jazz, Classical, Rock, Marches, Latin, Overtures & 20th Century techniques. Theory & music history are also taught, (our students will learn how to read music proficiently).

I have never played an instrument before! How do I learn?

Very few students in the middle school band program play an instrument before the seventh grade. We teach you as if you have never played before. Our goal is to keep every student "caught-up" all of the time. We also have voluntary extra-help sessions several times a week to advance your playing.

Why Band? Can it really help my test scores?

Time and time again it has been proven that participating in a band program can help students do better on achievement tests. Band students scored higher than their non-band classmates by an average of 11 pts. in MATH, and 18 pts. in VERBAL skills. The study also shows that longer participation, (4 yrs.), can raise MATH scores to 32 pts. and VERBAL scores to 46 pts. Higher than non-band classmates!!

What can I play?

There are no HARD or EASY instruments in band. We try to match students to the instrument that best suits their physical abilities. This ensures a better "fit" with each student which in turn increases their chances of success. The choices for the seventh grade band students are; FLUTE, OBOE, BASSOON, CLARINET, ALTO & TENOR SAX, TRUMPET, FRENCH HORN, TROMBONE, BARITONE HORN, TUBA, AND PERCUSSION.

How much does an instrument cost?

Buying an instrument is very much like buying a computer or a car. Make, model, year, new or used, and extras can increase or decrease the cost. We recommend calling around to get the best price for the quality of instrument. Even with a student model instrument you get what you pay for. Go with companies that have a good product to cost ratio. We have sample rental literature from area companies that we utilize. We work directly with these vendors to varying degrees.

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
