AT THE LIBRARY

FOOD AND NUTRITION SERVICES UPDATES FOR THE 2012-13 SCHOOL YEAR

Welcome back! Just a reminder that as part of the Healthy Hunger Free Kids Act of 2010 Section 205 we are once again required to increase lunch prices for this school year. Student lunches will be \$2.00 at all schools. Breakfast will remain at \$1.25. In addition, the USDA has created new nutrition and meal planning regulations that will begin this school year. The notable changes are as follows:

- Fruit and vegetable portion sizes will increase for all grade levels.
- Vegetable subgroups such as dark green, red/orange, beans/peas and starchy vegetables will be required each week.
- All students MUST have at least one fruit or vegetable on their tray to make a meal (\$2.00). If they do not, then they must be charged a la carte pricing for every item on their tray.
- At least half of the grains served must be whole grain.
- There will be a limit to the amount of grains and protein served each week.

We are already meeting many of these guidelines which will help with the student transition. We will continue to work hard to provide high quality, delicious and nutritious meals for our students. FOOD AND NUTRITION SERVICES CHARGE POLICY EFFECTIVE 2012-13

ALL students may charge up to 3 meals. After 3 meals, students are provided an alternate lunch consisting of a peanut butter graham sandwich, a fruit and a milk for \$1.00.

Students who are charging, have a negative balance, or owe charges are not permitted to purchase a la carte items such as snacks, milk, ice cream (MS and HS), etc. All funds that are brought in for the student's account will be first deposited toward the outstanding balance prior to the student being allowed to purchase any a la carte items.

Your student will receive a weekly notice in their back pack if they have a negative account balance. Parents will be notified by phone every other week as well. Additionally, negative balance notifications will be mailed home monthly. You can also view your child's account balance for free at www.EZschoolpay.com.

ATTENTION If you feel that you may need assistance in paying for your child's meals, please complete a Free/Reduced Meal Application and return it to your child's school office. Applications were available in the Food and Nutrition Services Department packet during book days and are now available in your child's school office.

MIDDLE SCHOOL NEWS

Sunman-Dearborn Middle School has started the school year with many great opportunities for our students. We have expanded our curriculum options for students by offering additional elective classes. These classes include: journalism, daily living skills class, art, structured study skills, math lab, language lab and agriculture science. Our journalism class will be putting together articles for our monthly newsletter, as well as, developing our Groovy News show for the SDMS student body. Structured study skills class provides remediation individualized to the students' deficits, weekly grade checks and structured homework help in the classroom. Students in structured study skills track their activities daily in the classroom; develop routines for study and organization such as daily completion of their agendas and tracking personal grade progress. Our daily living skills class provides opportunities for students to explore job responsibility and completing tasks efficiently. In addition, some of our students in Agriculture Science have the chance to earn credits before even entering the doors of high school. Students have been excited to have these options and we hope to continue to offer a variety of options for our students.

S-DMS is committed to increasing our attendance rate this school year. We currently have an average attendance rate of 94.6%. This falls short of the state target and our goal. We ask parents to help us by enforcing our attendance policy with your children and to require them to come to school on a daily basis. We will be increasing our methods of communication with parents and guardians this year when students are not present in order to increase the awareness that your child's attendance does impact our school. We will also be offering additional incentives to encourage better attendance from our students.

S-DMS will be initiating our Parent Advisory Team this fall as well. It is our goal to involve our parents and community into the educational process. We want to build awareness of initiatives, allow opportunities for input and feedback. We feel that communication is critical to our students' success. One class of new kindergarteners at Bright Elementary

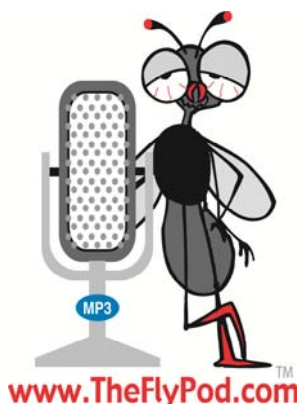

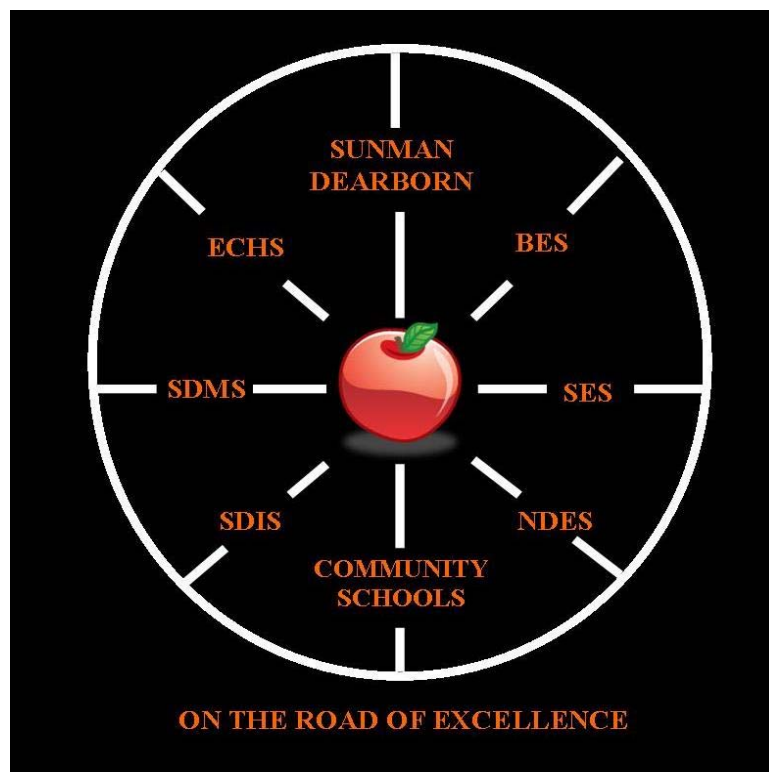
