As we all know, the Presidential race comes down to making a choice. The public selects who they think will be the best candidate to serve our nation for the next four years. In many ways, public schools are also trying to convince the public that there is a clear choice in "who" should be educating our children. From a local perspective, I want to make a case as to why Sunman-Dearborn Community Schools is the best place to send your student to get a great education. It begins with our vision and mission for our school corporation.

Sunman-Dearborn Community Schools has a clear vision for our school corporation:

We will become the highest

performing school corporation in southeast Indiana by June 2015, and one of the 10 highest performing districts in the state of Indiana by June 2017.

Sunman-Dearborn Community Schools' mission focuses on helping students develop in the areas of:

Literacy skills (reading, writing, communicating confidently)

Mastery of state and national standards

Character, responsibility, teamwork, the importance of regular attendance, goal-directedness, and service to community

High graduation rates and postsecondary success

With our vision and mission focused on student learning, any campaign would need to share the results of the work being accomplished. Here is just a sampling of some of the accomplishments from our schools:

1. Sunman-Dearborn Community School's students had the highest gains on the Indiana Statewide Test for Educational Progress (ISTEP+) during the 2011-2012 school year. Overall, our students received a passing score of 85.8% on the English/Language Arts proficiency, a passing score of 89.0% on the Math proficiency and 81.8% on passing both the

English/Language Arts and Math proficiencies.

East Central High School offers students the choice of four graduation diplomas that include the General Diploma (opt out), the Core 40 Diploma, the Core 40 Technical Honors Diploma, and the Core 40 Academic Honors Diploma. East Central High School also provides students opportunities to earn college credits with the Advanced Placement (AP) program and Dual Credit Courses. East Central currently provides students with 14 AP courses and 14 Dual Credit courses. The success of our educational program at ECHS is reflected in our 2012 results: 92.4% of our students graduated from East Central High School with 77.2% of those students earning a Core 40 or higher diploma. We also have 83.5% of those graduating seniors who will further their education at a vocational/technical school, college, or university.

3. Sunman-Dearborn Community Schools has established a strong extracurricular program for our students. Over 50% of our East Central High School students participate in more than 35 different academic teams and extracurricular clubs. Nearly one-third of the student body participates in one or more of the ten different sports offered throughout the school

year. Furthermore, our focus is on developing student-athletes first. Our students who participate in our athletic programs have a grade point average of 3.14 on a 4.0 scale. Team GPAs range from 2.83 to 3.65.

Like any candidate running for office, the claim that's always made is that there is a clear choice. I would state the same point when it is time to select a

school that best fits the needs of students, but more importantly, helps students reach high levels of academic success. It should be obvious that the best choice for a student to get a great education is Sunman-Dearborn Community Schools.

In closing, I would ask that you research our schools, come for a visit, and then you will also make the same choice that nearly 4000 families have made this year, and that is for your children to attend Sunman-Dearborn Community Schools.

### NATIONAL SCHOOL LUNCH WEEK

October 15-19 is National School Lunch Week. Did you know that the National School Lunch Program (NLSP) serves over 31 million children across the country everyday? Our district alone serves over 3,000 lunches each day.

School meals have gotten a bad rap over the years, but school meals are healthier than you might remember as a child. Here are a few facts you might not know:

- Fresh fruits and veggies are offered daily in all schools
- At least half of all grains served are whole grain rich
- Our lunches have 0g of trans fat and less than 10% saturated fat
- Low fat and fat free dairy is offered daily
- All foods are baked and never fried

Recent research has shown that students who eat school meals perform their best

academically. Additionally, healthy eating correlates to fewer trips to the school nurse and less absenteeism.

Finally, the American Journal of Public Health found that children who eat lunch at school are more likely to consume milk, fruit and veggies and less likely to consume daily desserts and snacks compared to children who bring lunch from home. Encourage your child to help us celebrate National School Lunch Week on October 15

and 16 by purchasing lunch at school those days.




