FOOD AND NUTRITION SERVICE DEPARTMENT UPDATES

As a part of the USDA and Healthy Hunger Free Kids Act of 2010's push for healthier foods in schools, there will be a few changes made to your students breakfast, lunch and snacks. The most notable changes will be:

- Sodium restrictions for all meals and snacks
- All grains served will be whole grain rich
- More strict calorie, fat and sugar restrictions for snacks (a la' carte)

We will still continue to serve a variety of fresh fruit and vegetables daily. All of the meals served are calculated to ensure the appropriate calories and nutrients for each student's age. We strive to serve nutritious and appetizing meals to our students every day to encourage them to thrive as young, healthy individuals.

**REMINDER: As this school year begins to wind down, please do not forget to pay off any negative balances that your student's may have on their breakfast/lunch accounts. Please also remember that any money left in the student's account will roll over to the next school year. **

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
